

MINUTES OF A REGULAR MEETING OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TEANECK
HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING ON TUESDAY, JULY 29th, 1930.

Communication from Supervisor of Roads, County of Bergen, enclosing three photographs of conditions on Cedar Lane after the recent storm. This is in a large measure due to the entrance to your driveway being water bound macadam which washes out and the force of the water coming down the hill piles it in a heap on the highway, and after each storm we have to clean it up. If a coat of bituminous dressing were placed on the water bound macadam entrance and the intersection paved with a penetration, this would not occur. I was instructed by the Public Works Committee to request that you seriously consider the construction of curbs on Cedar Lane from Garrison Avenue west to the River Road, so that we may carry the pavement to the curb and overcome the constant wash of red clay over the highway from the River Road south.

Communication from Free Public Library requesting the sum of \$6,186.00 to carry on their work.

Communication from Assessment Commission - Due to an error in the assessment map we recommend that the sewer lateral assessment against Block 138, lot 7, assessed under the Northwest Sewer lateral be increased from \$126.70 to \$159.28 and the assessment for trunk and disposal assessed under Contract "P" be increased from \$29.75 to \$37.40.

Referred to Committee as a whole.

Communication from Assessment Commission - Due to an error in the assessment map, we recommend that the lateral sewer assessed under the Northwest laterals against Block 138, lot 6, be reduced from \$238.30 to \$181.00, and that the trunk and disposal under Contract "P" against the above lot be reduced from \$55.25 to \$42.50. The sewer assessment against Block 138, lot 5, is correct as assessed.

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck, N. J. that an error was made by Edward J. Dohring in overpaying \$22.00 on Block 100, lots 53 and 54 on the northwest sewer laterals,

WHEREAS the above named assessment levy has been paid in full and now shows \$22.00 overpaid,

J., that an error has been made by the Hudson Engineering and Construction Company in paying the 1928 taxes on block 290, lots 15, 16 and 17, in amount \$38.38, instead of paying on lots 12, 13 and 14 in the same block

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is empowered to transfer the payment from lots 15, 16 and 17 in block 290 to lots 12, 13 and 14 in the same block.

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that the former tenant of Block 103-B, lots 11 and 12 no longer resides in Teaneck,

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to cancel poll and personal taxes in amount \$7.08 for the year 1930.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, representative was declared adopted.

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that the 1928 taxes on property known as Block 289, lots 9 to 12 were assessed on one parcel,

WHEREAS this property was deeded as lots 9-10 and 11 prior to the closing of the 1928 tax duplicates.

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to apportion said taxes and transfer the overpayment of that portion of the original levy, namely, lot 12 to the credit of block 289, lots 18-19 and 20.

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that an error had been made in assessing Warwick Avenue curbing and paving against block 287, lots 27a to 32a,

WHEREAS the difference amounts to \$63.00 due to the apportionment of the original levy,

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to transfer \$63.00 balance now appearing against lots 27a to 32a block 287 to lots 32 to 40 in same block.

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to cancel personal taxes in amount \$6.08 for the year 1930.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. Hanniball:

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that an error had been made in assessing property known as Block 373, lot 1, under Contract T, U and Y and 6 and 9a,

WHEREAS in accordance with the recommendation of the Assessment Commission this property should have been assessed on the basis of 797 feet instead of 850 feet,

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to reduce the assessment on his records from \$2,388.50 to \$2,239.57 under Contract 6 and 9a, and from \$1,785.00 to \$1,673.70 under Contract T, U and Y.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. Hanniball:

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that an error had been made in assessing property known as Block 138, lot 9, under Lindbergh Blvd. & River Road Sanitary sewers and River Road Sanitary Sewers, Cont. "v",

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to reduce the assessment on his records from \$476. to \$328. under Lindbergh Blvd. and River Road Sanitary Sewers and from \$208.25 to \$143.50 under River Road Sanitary, Cont. "v".

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. Hanniball:

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that an error had been made in the Glenwood Park sewer assessment in assessing Block 362, lot 14 for a sewer connection,

WHEREAS upon investigation by the Engineering Department this connection was installed to lot 15, block 362,

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to relieve lot 14, block 362, of a sewer connection in the amount of \$20.00 and assess lot 15 in the same block for a sewer connection.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. Hanniball:

WHEREAS it appears to the satisfaction of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck that an error had been made in assessing property known as Block 138, lot 8 under the Northwest District and Contract "P",

RESOLVED THEREFORE that the Tax Collector be and he hereby is authorized to cancel the assessment for \$181.00 assessed under the Northwest Sewer District and for \$42.50 under Contract "P".

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. Hanniball:

WHEREAS on March 14th, 1930, the tax collector of the Township of Teaneck sold premises known as lots 47 and 48 in block 51 for 1928 taxes to Paramount

Investment Corporation as evidenced by tax sale certificate 508 in the sum of One Hundred forty-nine dollars and sixty-six cents (\$149.66); and

WHEREAS it appears that in reliance upon tax search certificate 76713 dated January 31, 1929, issued to Fidelity Union Title Mortgage & Guaranty Company of Hackensack, N. J., said company accepted a mortgage of Four Thousand Five Hundred Dollars dated March 22, 1929 and recorded in book 1147 of mortgages, page 589, in the Bergen County Clerk's office, and paid the consideration therefor, and

WHEREAS it appears said certificate failed to set forth 1928 taxes resulting in the tax sale above mentioned, and all the facts aforesaid have been duly proved by affidavit or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Township Committee,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the tax collector is authorized to procure an assignment from the Paramount Investment Corporation to the Township of Teaneck and to refund to said Paramount Investment Corporation said sum of \$149.66 and interest at 6%, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the lien of said 1928 taxes be and is hereby released as to, and declared hereby to be subordinate to, said mortgage of \$4,500 held by the Fidelity Union Title Mortgage and Guaranty Company, its successors and assigns and more particularly described in preamble hereto, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in all other respects, that the lien of said 1928 taxes and interest shall remain a lien upon said premises covered by said mortgage and known as lots 47 and 48 in block 51 as to the interest of the owners thereof, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Clerk be and he hereby is instructed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the tax collector who is authorized to adjust his records accordingly and to the Fidelity Union Title Mortgage and Guaranty Company.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Hanniball, seconded by Mr. Reilly:

WHEREAS the location of a proposed overhead crossing to eliminate the grade crossing existing at the intersection of Fort Lee Road and the West Shore Railroad in the Borough of Bogota, is now under consideration before the Board of Public Utilities Commission of the State of New Jersey, and

WHEREAS the Township of Teaneck has a real interest in the location of said overhead crossing due to the fact that many of the residents of the Township of Teaneck are commuters on said railroad making use of its station facilities daily, and

WHEREAS it has been proposed that said overhead crossing be located one block northerly from the present location at Fort Lee Road to Main Street; and

WHEREAS the location of said station, station facilities, and overhead crossing of the West Shore Railroad at Main Street would be most practical in every respect,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck in the County of Bergen hereby publicly records itself in favor of, and hereby requests the proper authorities to locate said proposed overhead crossing and station facilities of the West Shore Railroad at Main Street in the Borough of Bogota, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to forward a certified copy of this resolution to the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bogota, the Board of Public Utilities Commission of the State of New Jersey, the West Shore Railroad Company, and the Board of Chosen Freeholders, and all other parties concerned.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Hamiball, seconded by Mr. Falt:

RESOLVED that the Hackensack Water Company be and hereby are authorized to extend their distributing system in Wyndham Road -

36 ft. of 6" pipe W. from d.e. w. of Lincoln Place

84 ft. of 6" pipe W. from d.e. w. of Lincoln Place

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

Mr. Scherer - We have petition here as residents of Martense Avenue relative to improvement of the street. From attending the meetings we understand that the Town hasn't got the money to go ahead with it. It isn't our desire to press the Town in an unsensible fashion, but we do believe that they have a road gang that could take care of the street. I believe the street on the east side is Lincoln Place, one block north of that is concrete and the rain pours down after every storm into Martense Avenue washing away the street, making holes 2½' to 3' deep,

making it dangerous to ride an automobile. Every time there is a storm our sidewalks are covered with mud.

Chairman - Township has ordinance passed and we are ready to go ahead, but we can't do so because of the new law passed this spring that fixed the debt limit. I think we are in accord with you and we think you should have the improvement. I believe the Engineering Department will go down there and if there is anything they can do temporarily in there they will be glad to do it.

Mr. Hanniball - I spoke to Mr. Scherer and I have been speaking to Mr. Wells and we are trying to find out what we can put there that won't wash away. It is a deplorable condition. Their lawns are covered with muck and dirt. We don't want to spend a lot of money on it. Next year that street will be improved.

Dr. Spiegelglass - About that resolution about Town of Bogota. I really think we have problems right here in this Town, we shouldn't interfere with Town further away. That might involve thousands of dollars by giving suggestion. If the station goes over to the next street people on Fort Lee Road who paid thousands of dollars, will be affected, and I think Town of Teaneck should stay out of that trouble. I don't think that resolution is proper interfering in someone else's affairs. I am surprised to hear something done here for Town of Bogota.

Chairman - It affects Teaneck. It affects DeGraw Avenue and that whole section.

Dr. Spiegelglass - That has been a county highway, and people who paid taxes for many years they paid the price for business property. Now they want to take station away and all the stores and business property will be vacant. I think you should leave that entirely alone. I think Bogota has enough troubles of their own. I think that resolution was out of order.

Mr. Brophy again requested the signs in the Garrison section, stating that they had been promised and he wanted the promise kept. Mr. Hanniball informed him that he thought it was settled satisfactorily, and that if he had come to him two months ago the signs would be in. Chairman asked that he give us another month and the signs will be in.

Mr. Shea and a few other gentlemen from Martense Avenue protested against the condition of this street.

Mr. Wells - It is a mighty hard thing to repair that road so it will last. We have had the road gang go in and do what little we could by cleaning the catch basins. Martense Avenue is not an accepted street. It is not actually a Town charge, but we recognize the fact that people pay taxes and we should do something. Now we can go in there and spend \$200. or \$300. and it can be washed out in the next storm. I will have the gang down there and fill up holes and keep it clean and spend several hundred dollars, but I am afraid you will have bad condition for the whole year.

Mr. McCarthy - They feel that great deal of trouble comes from rain of upper streets, the paved streets. That being the case, it may be advisable to put shoulder and steer water off in some other direction.

Mr. Lockwood made protest against the extra mileage charge being charged by the Telephone Company in West Englewood, requesting that the Committee make proper representation to the Public Utilities Commission, the Legislature at Trenton and Governor Larson to wipe out the tariff which is now obsolete. That Teaneck have an exchange of its own and not be divided into two units.

Chairman suggested that Mr. Lockwood present his views on this matter in writing. Mr. McCarthy suggested that we have a meeting and have Mr. Lockwood and a gentleman from the Telephone Company present.

On motion made, seconded and carried, meeting adjourned to August 12, 1930.
