

MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TEANECK HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING ON FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 26th, 1930.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and on the roll call the following members responded: Chairman Walker, Committeemen Hanniball, Reilly, Falt and McCarthy.

The Clerk read the following - "The undersigned members of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck do hereby waive notice of a special meeting of the Township Committee to be held at the Municipal Building on Friday evening, September 26th, 1930, at 8:30 P.M. (Daylight Saving Time,) and we do hereby further waive notice of the purpose of said meeting and we do hereby consent to the transaction of all lawful and proper business that may come before said meeting," signed by all members of the Township Committee.

A motion was made by Mr. McCarthy, seconded by Mr. Reilly, that the waiver of notice be received and filed with the minutes of the meeting.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, motion was declared carried.

Chairman - The purpose of the meeting is to act upon the petition of the Police and paid Firemen to have a compulsory referendum voted upon at the General Election on November 4th concerning an increase in salaries for the police and paid firemen.

A motion was made by Mr. McCarthy, seconded by Mr. Hanniball, that the regular order of business be suspended.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, motion was declared carried.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. McCarthy:

WHEREAS at a meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck held on September 23rd, 1930, a resolution was adopted to submit to a referendum the question of fixing the salary or salaries of the police and fire Departments of the Township of Teaneck at the amounts stated in petitions submitted to the Township Committee; and

WHEREAS said resolution further purported to submit at said referendum a proposition which included fixing the salaries of the superior officers of the Police Department, and

WHEREAS upon advice of the Township attorney it is deemed improper to submit the question in a form other than as petitioned;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the resolution adopted at a meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Teaneck on September 23rd, and recited in the preamble hereof, be and the same is hereby rescinded and for nothing holden.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

The following resolution was offered by Mr. Reilly, seconded by Mr. McCarthy:

WHEREAS petitions signed by more than twenty percentum of the legal voters of the Township of Teaneck have been duly submitted to the Township Committee requesting that there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the Township of Teaneck the question of fixing the salaries of the Police and paid firemen of the Township of Teaneck at the amount or amounts stated in said petitions;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Clerk of the County of Bergen be and he is hereby requested to print upon the sample and official ballots to be used at the next General Election in the Township of Teaneck, that is to say November 4th, 1930, the following question, viz:

"Shall the salaries of the Police and paid Firemen of the Township of Teaneck be fixed as follows, commencing January 1st, 1931, viz:

"Commencing at \$2200.00 per annum and increasing \$100.00 annually until the maximum of \$2500.00 per annum is reached.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be certified and delivered by the Township Clerk to the Clerk of the County of Bergen at least thirty days before said General Election.



On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

As there was no other business to be considered, a motion was made by Mr. McCarthy, seconded by Mr. Hanniball, that the meeting adjourn.

On roll call all Committeemen being in favor and none against, motion was declared carried.
