

MINUTES OF AN ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TEANECK
HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING ON WEDNESDAY, March 25, 1931.

The Mayor called the meeting to order at 8:25 P.M. and on the roll call the following members responded: Mayor Van Wagner, Councilmen Morten and Paquin.

Mr. Volcker submitted the following tabulation on the bids received on six cars -

Cliff Motor Car Co. and B.M.P. Motors did not bid in strict accordance with the specifications.

Ridgefield Park Auto Co. is low with a bid of \$3,140.00.

Mr. Morten - Do you recommend that the bid of the Ridgefield Park Auto Company be accepted?

Mr. Volcker - I do.

A motion was made by Mr. Morten, seconded by Mr. Paquin, that the bid of the Ridgefield Park Auto Company in the amount of \$3,140.00 be accepted.

Mayor - Have you considered, Mr. Volcker, the close proximity of the maintenance of the Chevrolet Company?

Mr. Volcker - Yes. The Chevrolet Company submits a letter purporting to show that the waiting time for repairs will amount to \$626.00.

Mr. Paquin - If we allowed Shea to subtract that from their total they are still high.

Mr. Volcker - Yes.

Mayor - Do you know if the owners of the Ridgefield Park Auto Company are residents of Teaneck?

Mr. Volcker - They are.

Mayor - Before I vote yes, I believe I express the sentiment of the Council when I say we would prefer to give contracts and bids or anything on which the Town needs replacements to local bidders, all things being equal, but we have no alternative other than to accept the bid of the lowest bidder.

On roll call all Councilmen present voting in favor and none against, motion was declared carried.

Discussion was held on the appointment of three policemen. Five or six of the men who took the examination were disqualified inasmuch as they were not the required height. It was decided that the first three in rating be advised to arrange with the Township Manager for a physical examination, and that a police reserve of ten men be considered.

A motion was made by Mr. Morten, seconded by Mr. Paquin, that the Township Manager notify the first three men in rank in the examinations that they will be considered for appointment as soon as they pass a satisfactory medical examination, and that they arrange with the Township Manager for that examination, the cost of the examination to be paid by the applicants.

On roll call all Councilmen present voting in favor and none against, motion was declared carried.

A resolution was offered by Mr. Paquin, #447, seconded by Mr. Morten, releasing to Ole C. Olsen, owner of lots Block 284-A, lots 1 to 6, any right or easement which it may or might have had over any other portion of the lots hereinbefore referred to, save and except the portion referred to in the grant or easement set forth in the indenture dated March 2, 1931.

On roll call all Councilmen present voting in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

A resolution was offered by Mr. Morten, #448, seconded by Mr. Paquin, granting to the Township of Teaneck the right to construct, lay, repair and maintain beneath the surface of the soil a storm sewer or drain in Block 284-A, lots 1 to 6.

On roll call all Councilmen present voting in favor and none against, resolution was declared adopted.

Mr. Volcker reported that the State Highway Commission had decided to ad-

here to the original plan which had been agreed upon some eighteen months ago for the approaches to State Highway Route #4 at Teaneck Road.

A motion was made by Mr. Paquin, seconded by Mr. Morten, that the meeting adjourn.

On roll call all Councilmen present voting in favor and none against, motion was declared carried.

Meeting adjourned at 9:45 P.M.
