I, Michael Pagan., residing at 665 River Road, Teaneck NJ 07666, 201-543-7671, request the School Ethics Commission to consider a complaint against the above-named Respondent(s) whose home address is 350 Johnson Ave, Teaneck NJ 07666, and 663 Chestnut Ave, Teaneck NJ 07666 in accordance with the authority of the School Ethics Commission to entertain such complaints under N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21 et seq.

The facts upon which this complaint is based are as follows: (Please print additional pages as needed. Students should be identified by initials only.)

1. Statement of facts: On Wednesday October 10th, 2018 an official e-mail was sent from the Township of Teaneck School's e-mail noreply@teaneckschools.org containing a hypertext link to a number of fliers including one for Math Adventures and Word Play. This flier states "BRING YOUR TEXTBOOKS AND NOTERBOOKS. JOIN US FOR FREE MATHEMATICS, READING & WRITING ENRICHMENT". This flier also included and directed parents to visit the website www.mvmawp.org or to call Ardie Walser at 201-287-1234. Ardie Walser is the Teaneck Board of Education Board President. Additional contact options are given to call 201-836-7275 or to e-mail walser@cuny.cuny.edu, and makes it clear to contact Dr. Ardie Walser, Kesha Rodriguez, or Ardie Walser's spouse Pat Philips patv@optonline.net.

In addition to offering tutoring this group also includes an example of last year's Parent Voice Box or PVB Forum with such topics including:

- a. Partnering on Success- Parents and teachers are integral in the success of students academic achievement. Developing a strong partnership with your

son or daughters teacher is not only necessary it's almost impossible to have a successful outcome without it.

- b. Parent Grand Slam- It's not always easy to understand what you need to do as a parent to support your children in school. It's important to understand your role and the impact it can have in making a difference in your child's success. In this panel discussion, you will hear first-hand from parents who successfully managed their children's academic career.

Date of occurrence: Wednesday October 10th, 2018 & ongoing.

I assert this to be a violation of: N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24(a), (c) & (d), because Dr. Walser as a member of the Board of Education and the President of the Board of education is in conflict with his duties in the eye of the public interest. This program although well intentioned should not have been promoted in this context with the district. A Principal, Administrative official or Teacher is put in an uncomfortable position when correspondence is being requested which includes the name of or at the request of a Board of Education member, most notably the President. The public interest is held when a board member discharges their duties unbiased, however when a Board Member like Dr. Walser, is the Director of this program, as is his spouse there is inherently a conflict with his official role and this role. In furtherance of this claim, Dr. Walser is directly interacting with Teaneck Students and making commentary on the academic work they are being exposed to in the schools.

2. Statement of facts: Sometime on or about October 7th, 2017 the Teaneck Board of Education authorized a flier to be posted on the official board website for Math Adventures/Word Play. Upon clicking on the flier it is listed to contact Ardie Walser who is and was the Teaneck Board of Education President and who has the authority per the bylaws to determine what may and not be on the website.

Date of occurrence: 11/16/2018, date of accessing the website.

I assert this to be a violation of: N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24(a), (c) & (d), because Dr. Walser as a member of the Board of Education and the President of the Board of education is in conflict with his duties in the eye of the public interest. A Principal, Administrative official or Teacher is put in an uncomfortable position when correspondence is being requested which includes the name of or at the request of a Board of Education member, most notably the President. Furthermore as Board President he has a direct role in deciding what is and is not on the website.

3. Math Adventures and Wordplay hosted a Parent Voice Box Session:
November 17, 2018

This event was posted on various PTO organizations after a receipt of an e-mail from Dr. Walser. Furthermore current board member Shahanaz Arjumand posted on her Facebook page presenting this event as a "Message from Ardie Walser"

These events are pushed by various board members and the school thus making them appear to be official events.

Other events have also included topics like: November 3, 2018
Why Your Vote Matters

Do you know how the school board works and how the budget is allocated? Where do you fit in? Come learn about the role of the Board, and the superintendent and how the school system runs. Understand why your vote matters.

Date of occurrence: 11-17-2018.

I assert this to be a violation of: N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24(a), (c) & (d), because, although this is a genuine effort to help educate the community, it is a topic of discussion of the operations of the schools, particularly on the basis of Technology and Education. The role that Dr. Walser has as a director of this program blurs the line between public life and private life, and makes it appear that this is a official Teaneck Township Board of Education event. In Furtherance of the issue, Shahanaz Arjumand, who is also a board member, shared this event on social media. The board members are acting in a substantial conflict with the proper discharge of their duties in the public interest. These events which are frequently attended by more than a majority of the Board are advertised in a way to appear official and thus prejudice the independence and judgments of official action. The public is being send an implicit message, come here and discuss your schools or remain silent.

4. In an e-mail dated 11-19-2018 Ardie Walser acting in his official capacity as a board member sent from the e-mail **Ardie Walser** awalser@teaneckschools.org the following text in the body of the e-mail:

"If you would like to meet and talk about your concerns you will find me on Saturdays between 9:00 AM and 12:30 PM at St. Mark's Episcopal church (118 Chadwick Ave Teaneck) working with students, from all over northern New Jersey and New York, along with their parents in an effort to improve education for ALL. For more details checkout the Math Adventures & Word Play website (www.MYMAWP.org). I am confident that I can find a break in the action giving us some time to talk. If that is not convenient please give me a few dates and times that might work better for you."

This e-mail is provided in whole for the review of this commission it is important to note that not only were board members and members of the public on this e-mail but also parents and the superintendent of schools.

This is also a promise of discussing board policy and operations within his private training group and is highly improper. No board member holds individual powers over another only collectively as a board can they set policy.


Date of occurrence: 11-19-2018.

I assert this to be a violation of: N.J.S.A. 18A:12-24(a), (c) & (d), because Dr. Walser is urging a member of the public to come to his event to discuss official board actions. This again blurs the line between board member and what their role is. By utilizing the official Teaneck Schools e-mail this is perceived as an official school event and in inclusion of the Board member and the CSA, he is reinforcing his role that this program is held above all others for his benefit.

WHEREFORE, I, as Complainant, request that the School Ethics Commission find and determine that the above-named Respondent(s) has violated the School Ethics Act and that he or she be subject to such penalty as provided by the Act.



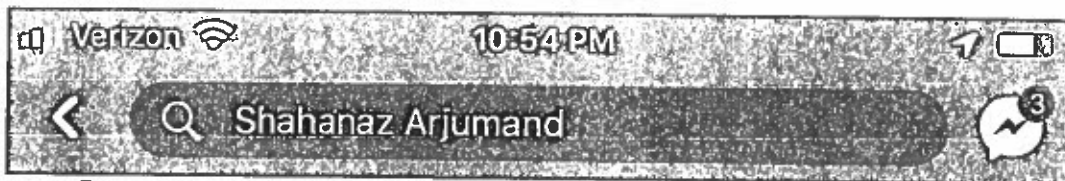

Board Members

The Teaneck Public School District is committed to the belief that an effective school program can only be accomplished by nurturing a partnership between the schools and the community. Members of the Board of Education and district staff appreciate your interest in the business of the school system and board meetings. Public understanding, participation and communication are vital to maintain a successful educational environment within our public schools.

Decisions made by your elected school board affect the education of our children and, therefore, the well-being of this community. Your school board can best represent its constituents when members of the community take the time to observe the Board of Education in action, express their opinions, ask questions and communicate their needs in the public setting. Your continued interest and support guarantees the excellence of our schools.

The Teaneck Public School District has a nine-member Board of Education that serves its community without remuneration. The Board of Education is elected by the community to provide leadership and citizen oversight of the district's schools, which service 4,500 students. Among its many responsibilities, the Board establishes a long-term vision for the district and sets district policies and goals, while the Superintendent carries out the policies and manages the day-to-day operations of the district. Your Board also is committed to:

- Conscientiously deciding how to use the district's financial resources;
- Ensuring accountability to the local community, including personnel, programmatic and fiscal accountability;
- Providing community leadership and advocacy at the state and national levels on behalf of public education and all Teaneck students.

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Three of the nine seats are up for election each year. Legislation, (P.L. 2011, c.202), signed by Governor Christie on January 17, 2012 gives communities the option to change the date of the annual school board member election to November. At the January 18, 2012 Regular Public Meeting, the Board voted unanimously to change the date of the annual school election from April to Election Day in November. It is at this Election Day in November that voters will cast their ballots for three candidates to serve on the Board. Incumbent and/or newly elected Board Members are sworn in at the Reorganization Meeting. Regular Public Meetings

All are invited to the Board of Education Regular Public Meetings, which begin at 8:00pm, at Teaneck High School, Third Floor Cheryl Miller-Porter Student Center, 100 Elizabeth Avenue, Teaneck, a handicapped accessible building. The Board holds its one Regular Public Meeting on the second Wednesday of each month, September through June. Official business is conducted at its monthly meeting. The public may speak to agenda items prior to Board action on 11/17/2018

agenda and may address other issues at the conclusion of the business portion of the meeting. Conversations with the Board are scheduled at 7:30pm before each Regular Public Meetings, not Workshop Meetings.

Public Comment Sessions

The Board holds two public comment sessions to hear community input. The first public hearing segment is reserved solely for public comment on items appearing on the Board's business agenda. The second public hearing is conducted after the Board has acted on its monthly business meeting agenda. During this public segment, community members may speak on any issue of interest or concern. Each speaker will be allotted three minutes to address the Board.

Letters to the Board that appear on the agenda under correspondence may be discussed during the first public session. Agendas are available in the Board Office the afternoon of a scheduled meeting. At Special Public Meetings, which are called as necessary, the public may speak only to agenda items.

Announcements of meetings and meeting changes appear on the district web site and Cablevision Channel 77. The Regular Public Meetings are broadcast live.

Procedure to Address the Board

- Wait to be recognized by the Board President
- Come to the microphone at the speaker's podium
- State your name and address and, if applicable, position with the school district
- Be brief and to the point (a three-minute limit is customary)

Workshop Sessions

On the first Wednesday of each month, September through June, the Board holds a workshop session in the Central Administrative Offices, Eugene Fickel

School, Staff Development Room, One Merrison Street, a handicapped accessible building. At these monthly workshop meetings the Board reviews and discusses the business agenda that will be formally acted upon the following week. In addition to providing an opportunity to present information to the Board that requires action at the Regular Public Meeting, workshop meetings also include presentations on educationally relevant items of interest selected by the Superintendent with Board input. There is no formal action taken at these meetings and the public does not speak, except in special circumstances.

Conducting Business and Learning About Our Schools

A quorum of five Board members is needed to conduct any official school business. In addition to the Board, the Superintendent and members of his administrative team will be on hand to provide reports and explanations on matters of concern to the Board. At most meetings, a Curriculum & Instruction department representative will share information about program and service effectiveness, and future plans to enhance teaching and learning in and outside the classroom.

Focus on Student Achievement Workshop Sessions

Throughout the school year, the Board conducts workshop sessions that focus on the Superintendent's ACT (Achievement Challenge in Teaneck) initiative. These workshop meetings are usually conducted on the third or fourth Wednesday of each month during the school year. Administrative presentations emphasize district efforts to raise student achievement through academic intensification.

Meeting Schedule

Board Agendas

Board business agendas are available in the District Administration Building in the Board Secretary's Office on the day of the meeting and copies are available at each meeting. The agenda contains the business to be considered at each meeting. Board members receive the agenda and supporting documents several days before the meeting to ensure that they are prepared to review, discuss and make decisions regarding the monthly business at hand. The Board agendas and the minutes from previous public meetings are posted on the district web site.

Community Engagement

Citizen participation is an essential component to successful school programs. Members of the community may serve on their child's PTO or PTA and/or on district and school advisory councils. If you are interested, contact your child's school or call the Office of School/Community Relations at (201) 833-5512.

Our community serves as an important resource. We invite you to become involved in your child's school or a neighborhood school, call or stop by and find out how you can help. Volunteers are invaluable in our schools: tutoring students, serving on PTO/A boards or community councils, assisting teachers, supervising activities, etc. Call the school at which you would like to use your particular talents or interests to serve our children or the Office of School/Community Relations at (201) 833-5512.

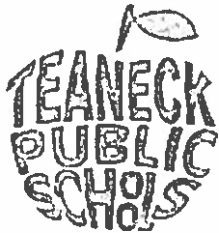
Addressing Concerns

If there is something you don't understand about the board or its actions all you need do is to ask and I will be happy to answer (so long as the information is not confidential).

Before regular public board meetings, at 7:30 PM, there is "Conversations with the Board," an informal session where members of the public can speak to board members face to face about those things in the district they are concern about or ideas or information that they wish to share. Other opportunities to share one's views and ask questions are during the two Public Comment sections (e.g., Agenda Only, Non-Agenda) of the workshop and regular public meetings.

There are additional opportunities to engage in the improvement of our public schools. The superintendent has created several community advisory committees giving members of our township an opportunity to join in with the school district on finding better ways to educate and support our young scholars, their parents, and the township of Teaneck. Dear Teaneck Parents, Staff, Students & Community Members,

Since joining Teaneck Public Schools in July, I have been meeting with many members of our community – from our parents, students and staff who are directly involved in the day-to-day concerns of our school district, to our community stakeholders who play a supporting role in the educational and emotional development of our children.

The feedback that I received over the past three months has been extremely helpful and I am a firm believer that any good system will continue to strive to become better – especially for the benefit of the more than 3500 children under our care.

As education continues to change, we need to anticipate that change. This is why I have created six Superintendent Advisory Committees, which will meet regularly throughout the school year:

- Beyond Diversity Committee
- Student Advisory Committee
- Faculty Advisory Committee
- Special Education Parent Advisory Committee • Faith-based Council
- Student Code of Conduct Review Committee

Each committee will include representatives from various stakeholder groups; and under the leadership of a Committee Chair, the members will have the opportunity to voice their opinions on how we move this district forward. I will take part in each committee's meetings on a quarterly basis.

Please note that two committees have a very specific charge. The Beyond Diversity Committee will explore how well our current school system works to provide all students and staff with equitable access to an education that embodies the mission and goals of Teaneck Public Schools. The Student Code of Conduct Review Committee will work towards the

development and implementation of equitable student-centered and grade-appropriate discipline language that supports the maturation and development of the whole student learner.

In full disclosure I wanted to share my Facebook post with you all that I posted today.

After thinking over my impressions of last night's school board meeting I have to honestly say I am genuinely worried about the fate of Teaneck and its schools. I feel as if we are going in the direction of Paterson and Passaic schools and I don't believe that is where this town ever wanted to be.

People are outraged by the appointment of Gervorin Rice into this role as well as the amount of money she is being paid. As an HR professional who has spent my career recruiting and hiring staff I have a genuine concern as to the validity of your recruitment process for this position.

I encourage you all to think about the ramifications of this decision. You can revoke this if need be and aware to someone else at a lesser salary as it was intended.

Good Afternoon Teaneck families,

As promised, I attended the board of education public meeting. I was saddened that even with all the excitement of the recent election, folks are still not coming out to see what is happening in the Teaneck school district. Of all the times to come out, last night would have been a good choice.

The school board meetings, when I do attend often remind me of the old Abbott and Costello routine "Who's on first?"

You know the bit where Bud Abbott appears to know exactly what he is speaking about and poor Lou Costello is trying

desperately to understand. And just at those moments where he feels he is close, Bud will throw in an additional comedic confusion sending Lou back to the beginning to start his journey towards understanding all over again.

Many times in those meetings I feel like poor old Lou.

Allow me to share my take away's from last night's meeting.

Large packets of paper are used to share the agenda items, repetitive voting attendance grids and policy after policy whether those policies are relevant to the evening's agenda or not. What's not in these packets for the public to review are the "walk in" agenda items, which tend to be the most interesting and conversation worthy as was the case last night.

Many packets are printed and put together in anticipation of Teaneck residents that they are hoping will come, but they never do so ½ a tree is then wasted in this effort and the packets are thrown into the recycling bin.(we hope) It has been recommended to the board previously (by me) to stop using the paper packets of information and create Power Point slides that can be changed or altered as late as five minutes before the presentation. This would save money on paper and labor in putting it together. Having a presentation on screen would allow both the board and the public who attends to understand exactly where they are when reviewing the agenda and can follow along. Not sure why this hasn't happened already, but let's hope they change it so that the board can become more efficient and the public has an easier time of following along with these important items.

The two walk in items that were discussed last night were interesting because it appeared that members of the board were hearing it for the first time along with the public. I thought the board always knew what all the items were going to be that came up for discussion in the public unless of course the public brought them up. But clearly that is not the case. Board members attended the meeting unprepared to share their committee reports. There seemed to be a whole lot of "well, we were looking at this, thinking about this and checking on this", but I never heard the coming together of information to arrive at a solution or idea. So my question about a board committee is this: Aren't the committees supposed to meet beforehand and understand what they are speaking about prior to getting to the public meeting? Remember I am still new to this game, so if I have this wrong please let me know, but based on my own professional experience on committees, if we didn't have our information together ahead of major meetings, no one was interested in hearing from us.

And lastly, I learned that we may be giving a highly compensated position under a newly obtained grant program to someone who is presently a known town official. Of all the candidates that have applied for this position it appears the only one qualified was someone who already holds a key role in the town? Even if it is legally defended, does it pass the "smell" test? I will let you Teaneck folks be the judge.
